Dogs #13, Gators #1

According to a story by **Marc Weiszer** at marc.weiszer@onlineathens.com, the Georgia Bulldogs ended their year as No. 13 in AP poll.

Georgia ended up at No. 13 in the final Associated Press college football poll released early last Friday morning.

It is true that the Bulldogs (10-3) were the preseason No. 1 team, the fact that they ended as a top-15 team for the sixth time in the last seven seasons can only be considered a small consolation. It tastes a little bitter since rival Florida is the national champion for the second time in the last three seasons.

"We are hungry," Georgia coach Mark Richt said earlier this week. "We're hungry for a championship. We're like the rest of our fans. We want to win. We want to win the (Southeastern Conference's) East. We want the SEC. We're going to fight like heck to do it."

Georgia had the lowest final ranking of a pre-season No. 1 team since Penn State was 16th in 1997. The Bulldogs finished No. 10 in the USA Today coaches' poll.

The Florida Gators defeated Oklahoma in the BCS national championship game, 24-14, night and won the AP title as well.

Florida received 48 of 65 first place AP votes. No. 2 and unbeaten Utah got 16 first-place votes and No. 3 Southern Cal (12-1) got the other. Texas and Oklahoma rounded out the top five.

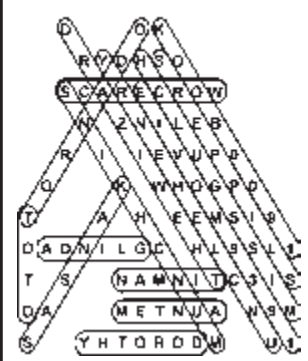
Georgia is one of five teams to finish in the top 15 in six of the last seven years. Southern California and Texas have been ranked top 15 every year during that span and Oklahoma and Ohio State in six of the last seven.

"We've won an awful lot of games since we've been here, even as of late," Richt said. "We won 11 last year, and we won 10 this year. That's not too shabby."

As one Georgia fan stated, "I won't even say wait till next year, with the team leaders heading to the NFL next year."

SEVERE WEATHER WEEK TO BE OBSERVED FEBRUARY 1 -7 Weather Radios For Sale

The Miller County Emergency Management Agency has partnered with the Miller County Commissioners and the Colquitt City Council to purchase 750 Midland WR 100 Public Alert Weather radios.

These radios will be available for purchase to any citizen of Colquitt and Miller County. MSRP of this radio is \$49.95, but will be available to the public for \$10.00 each. They will be limited to one radio per household.



Proof of residence will be required. This can be in the form of a driver's license, utility bill, voter registration card, etc.

The radios will be available for purchase by the Colquitt/Miller Citizen's Core Council on February 6 on a first come, first serve basis from 3:00 p.m. - 6:00 p.m. at Wilkin's IGA and Pic-n-Save. In the event any radios remain after this time period, there will be another opportunity to purchase them at a later date.

Anyone who purchased a weather radio from the county in 2008 will be not be eligible.

Grant funds were received to reduce the price from \$49.95 to \$10.00.

PUBLIC MEETING

The City of Colquitt hereby gives notice that a public meeting will be held to discuss a water improvements project funded by Georgia's Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (DWSRF) on February 18, 2009, at 12:00 p.m. in the Colquitt City Hall at 154 West Street.

The proposed project includes:

Construction of a new potable water well and extension of water lines to connect the City's water system with the water system at the golf course.

The purposes of the meeting are to:

- 1) Inform the public of the need for improvements to the City's water system.
- 2) To comply with Georgia's Rules for Safe Drinking Water and with the public participation requirements for Georgia's Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (DWSRF) Environmental Review Process.
- 3) To encourage public involvement in the development of a plan to improve the water system.

During the public meeting the City will attempt to identify public preferences for alternative methods of improving the City's Water Facilities. These alternatives will be evaluated and included in the City's Facilities Plan and Environmental Information Document, the major planning document covering the water system. These documents are available for public inspection through the date of the public meeting at City Hall during normal business hours.

Public participation is encouraged and considered essential to the selection and development of the final plan to be adopted prior to its approval by the State of Georgia, Department of Natural Resources.
